Language Arts: We will continue with our reading program *Rooted in Reading* throughout the month of March. Students will continue to be exposed to fiction and nonfiction text, along with other specific skills, including the setting (plot), character traits, illustrations/background, and character's feeling(s). Students are also utilizing reading strategies that include numbering the paragraphs, highlighting key words, writing the main idea(s) in the margin, and supporting answers to questions using text evidence. These objectives/strategies will help increase your child's reading comprehension, accuracy, fluency, and vocabulary in reading and in other content areas as well. In addition to utilizing iReady Reading, students can log onto www.mobymax.com for additional support in reading stories, reading skills literature, reading skills informational, language, and spelling. Readingeggs.com is another website (students can assess this website through their clever account) students use as well for ELA support.

Spelling—Students study and sort their word study words daily according to their weekly spelling pattern in addition to our phonics lessons in Letterland.

Writing—In addition to learning the parts of speech (noun, verb, etc.), students have continued to work through the steps of the writing process through our weekly writing prompts.

Math: Students will be working on comparing/adding/subtracting lengths, drawing & using bar/picture graphs, telling & writing time, and solving word problems involving money over the next couple of weeks in math. To assess MobyMax & the iReadyMath website, students need to type in their username & password (it's the same for each website). Your child should know their username & password; if not, please let me know & I'll get that information for you.

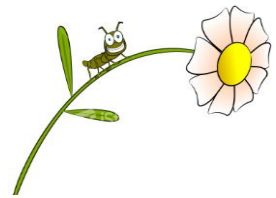
